Minutes of the MCQG Board Meeting Jan 20, 2018 at Dee's

Officer/Committee Reports:

President – Dee Van Driel: A prorated donation has been made to Attic Angel to close out 2017. Our new facility requires that the group have liability insurance. Barb Mayhew will consult with an insurance agent about this. The church has waived the janitorial fee provided we leave it cleaner than when we came. We need to continue to encourage clean up as we leave. We may need to designate a person or small group to check things before we leave. There was a discussion of how to display quilts that speakers bring. We may need someone to shadow our sound person to learn the sound board and someone to monitor the thermostat which can only be nudged up for a 2-hour time period.

Secretary – Diane Fulton: Minutes of the last meeting were approved. We need a replacement starting fall 2018.

Programs, Workshops, Retreats – **Derrith Wieman**: A few people have volunteered for the Program committee and the Market committee (a subgroup). Market will be May 5, a Saturday.

Afternoon Vice President – **Barb Mayhew**: Response to the holiday party was positive. We will return to Imperial Gardens next year and maybe choose a new location for the following year.

Evening Vice President – Gini Ewers: Replacement beginning fall 2018 is Terry Lichtenfelt.

Treasurer – **Diane Garlarneau**: A number of budget details were discussed.

Membership – **Mary Joy Johnson**: We now have 175-180 members.

Block Lotto - Judy Walahoski, Kathy Dorn: Printed directions will now be done in black and white.

Librarian – **Barb Roe**: Barb is reviewing all books. Anything that has not been checked out in four years will be sold at Market. Some books have been sold and money given to the treasurer. Our new facility is assessing space for the library cart.

Quilt Expo – **Dorothy Vesperman, Gretchen Rodefeld**: **Diane Galarneau** will be shadowing for this role for the remainder of this year and will assume the Expo role for the 2018-2019 year, with an as yet to be determined volunteer. The theme for 2018 is "Inspired by Nancy Zieman".

Newsletter - Dee Van Driel: The next deadline is in February.

Community Projects – Julayne Jelle: Not present. No report.

Social Media – Kristin Gumbinger, Heather Matanock: Heather will be ordering new program guides.

Announcing the 2018 Quilt Expo Mini-Quilt Challenge Theme

Participating in our annual Quilt Expo challenge is a great way for MCQG members to explore creativity, demonstrate skills, or try new techniques! This year's mini-quilt challenge theme is: **Inspired by Nancy Zieman**.

Challenge details:

- * Quilts must be 12" x 12" or smaller.
- * The quilt front must represent the theme: **Inspired by Nancy Zieman**.
- * The piece must be quilted (a little or a lot, by hand or machine).
- * A 3" sleeve must be attached to the quilt back along with a label including your first and last names plus the name of your quilt.
- * You may make more than one guilt if desired.
- * Quilts are due on or before the Guild's evening meeting in August (August 27th).
- * Late entries cannot be accepted.

Challenge quilts will be displayed in the Mad City Quilt Guild exhibit booth during the Quilt Expo, September 6-8, 2018. Thanks to Diane Galarneau for this year's theme idea!

January 22, 2018

Kristin Gumbinger: 2 charity quilts for Linus/Dane County foster kids: bright squares, half-square triangles, disappearing 9-patches, etc, with lots of piecing on each back, Kristin l.a.-quilted them

Julayne Jelle/Community Service: 10 Linus/baby and lap quilts; Linus group in county sorts about 500 quilts each month. All sizes are appreciated.

Bill Hoernke: table topper made using the Wefty needle to weave fabric

Mary Jane Getlinger: four-patch posie w/ garden chain setting, from Mary Joy's class; she l.a.-quilted it

Dave Garcia: jelly roll race quilt top in solids, took about 1½ hours

Lara Romine: Another round of baby quilts to make! This one, w/ bears/canoe panel and borders, is first of 5. **Julie Fagan:** (has been doing garment sewing lately) Finished a UFO in blue/brown batiks, split square in square; she l.a.-quilted it

Mary Vassalotti: Star Storm, big quilt w/ large star, fabric from Blue Bar; for Linus: sheep panel baby quilt; Broken Glass quilt design w/ pieced back, all l.a.-quilted on her Statler

Ann Hill: Her business partner collects unusual fabric; Ann made herself a quilt top from them.

Rita Loper: baby quilt in brights for her third grandbaby, in DC – flying out tomorrow

Heather Matanock: did lots of quilting last year! Showing her latest shop sample for BBQ: Crosses & Windows, in Cotton+Steel fabrics, set w/ turquoise

Kathy Stroshane: Christmas Knot WH (Jane's pattern), w/ purple Santa fabric, ordered online, on back

Laurel Strock: Jane's pattern: "Give Your Dog a Bone", but Laurel's is cats – for grandson

Nancy Blake: holiday/Christmas tree skirt in radiating bargello design, made for son, w/ French bulldog fabric on back

Donna Willadsen: 2 small quilts made with leftovers from other projects, for Linus; she quilted **Jane Vaughan**: new small quilt pattern: Windflowers, 20 blocks, l.a.-quilted by **Julie Fagan**

February 6, 2018

Pat Geishirt: Tree WH, made using quick curve ruler, for Deerfield guild challenge; Churn Dash quilt for another guild's challenge

Julayne Jelle/Community Service: 1 Linus quilt, with input from Marsha Toonen, Donna Corcoran, etc **Laurel Strock:** oldest son will be 40 soon, so she made him a quilt w/ big blocks featuring outdoor designs on fabric

Kathy Stroshane: tablerunner for a friend, using Gudren Erla technique for "Cathedral Windows"; 9-block quilt using Fiddley Bits pattern by Judy Hasheider has 1256 half-square triangles; Kathy made the mistake of domestic-machine quilting it like she would hand-quilt – around each HST!

Kristi Schultz: made the red/white/blue BLOTTO blocks, but they rotated the wrong direction, so she kept them and made a tablerunner

Laurie Friedman: made a Linus quilt to practice; all hand-pieced quilt, using Katja Marek's *The New Hexagon* book for English paper piecing her blocks

Dawn Adamany: 7-8" mini, paper-pieced pineapple, hand-quilted, in the style of George Siciliano

Nancy Pederson: James Place WH for son James w/ beer sayings around

Rebecca Schmidt: Bonnie Hunter's "Honoring the Lake", reduced size top, about 40" x 40"; Leader/Ender project for a 40" square top, to get rid of scraps

Sharon Walk: took Donna Mather's Judy Niemeyer class, Vintage Rose; brought her red/gray/black/white large quilt to "show the teacher"

Mary Vassalotti: took 2 of Donna's classes: tree skirt (not quilted yet) and Bear Claw pillow; warm flannel quilt/throw w/ fussy cut printed "appliques"; to practice using her new embroidery machine: 3 onesies for new grandniece, 5 Valentine "ornaments"

Janet Bailey: for Linus: bright circles on back is \$5 fabric from 2016 Market/front is little foxes w/ brights, wrapped binding back-to-front; Linus quilt w/ theme from her Great Courses DVD, which discussed differences across cultures of time, individuals, expressiveness, social norms, featuring a panel of a Japanese woman in a kimono, and back of bright individual color blocks; Rainbow Keys, using Amy Bradley laminated fabric
