**Laurie Friedman:** Farmer's Wife big quilt – 99 blocks!, set with pale yellow; she pieced the back and quilted it on her home machine

Helen Flores: made-fabric background, with off-center Fossil Fern line

Jean Muehlemann: pillow: all machine-embroidered; tablerunner using new-to-her puffy foam technique Jane Vaughan: Italian Tiles (her pattern), longarm-quilted by Dave Garcia; made another version from a Strip Club exchange of Tula Pink and Kaffe Fassett fabrics, called Cosmic Cams, laq by Holly Johnson

#### April 2, 2019

**Marsha Toonen:** won fabric 10 years ago, did her first freemotion quilting on it; Polar Vortex Tantrum WH: done in a weekend! – pineapple pattern in brights & white; Churn Dash (83 blocks) in deep taupe, big quilt **Deb Cavanaugh**: large quilt at Expo: Interlocking Frames, on gray, laq herself

Rebecca Schmitt: purse made from a pattern purchased at Expo, w/ lots of pockets

Mary Joy Johnson: another experiment with setting for a four-patch posie in rust w/ gray/green/misc, and 2-color binding, about 50x60, laq Holly Johnson

Julayne/Community Service: 9 more Linus quilts!; (FYI: 68"x72" = "generous twin" for foster kids)

We continue to donate quilts to Linus for teens graduating from the Foster Care Program, and welcome quilts of any size to be donated to area hospitals. Kits are available at meetings, and we continue to take donations of fabric, batting or thread. UW hospital doll patterns are available upon request.

We have gotten a request from UW Health for *fidget blankets*. These blankets are for "confused" patients to distract from medical apparatus, etc. You will find many ideas online, including Pinterest. Kits are available at meetings. Turn these in to Helen Flores, 273-8813.

Specifications are as follows:

- 1) Blankets should be small enough to drape over a patient's lap.
- 2) All embellishments should be securely attached to the blanket. (This is a must!)
- 3) Avoid small beads, baubles, etc. as they could become a choking hazard. Larger beads and buttons are acceptable as long as they are securely attached.

Any longarmers wanting to quilt a quilt top, please contact me. Batting and backing will be provided along with the quilt top.

Suggested quilt sizes for the Foster Care Program: 63" x 87" to 78" x 87". (These dimensions are on our website.)
