As a quilt enthusiast and historian, I collect vintage and antique quilts.

When I came upon this quilted coverlet made by Eveler Blankenship in 1970, I knew I wanted to remake it.

With scraps and bits of clothing, Eveler took a utilitarian coverlet to another level. She made it treat of color and value, balance and movement by using dark and medium in the blades, light scraps in the corners, and rotating each block 90 degrees.

As a nod to Eveler, I call this The Evie.

It is SO much fun to piece! With a few of my tips and tricks in class, you'll fall in love with foundation scrap and string piecing!

Run as free as your own scrap bag and imagination allow. You can make it monochromatic by focusing on a favorite color or a seasonal palette. You, like me and like Eveler, can do predominantly light-colored scraps. Or, you can just go crazy! It's completely up to you.
